We cannot register your copyright claim in this work because the material deposited represents less than the required minimum amount of original authorship on which to base a claim.

Copyright protects "original works of authorship" that are fixed in any tangible medium of expression. To be regarded as an "original work of authorship," a work must contain a certain minimum amount of original literary, pictorial, musical, or other copyrightable material. In all cases, copyright protects only the actual expression of the author; it does not protect the ideas, systems, or methods that are embodied in the author's writings.

Courts have ruled that words and short phrases such as names, titles, and slogans are not protected by copyright even if they are distinctively arranged or printed.
